Auxiliary Communications Service (ACS)

The Auxiliary Communications Service (ACS) was organized by the San Francisco Office of Emergency Services (OES) following the 1989 Loma Prieta Earthquake to support the communications needs of the City and County of San Francisco when responding to emergencies and special events.

The Auxiliary Communications Service holds General Meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at the San Francisco Emergency Operations Center, 1011 Turk Street (between Gough Street and Laguna Street), from 1900 hours to 2100 hours local time. All interested persons are welcome to attend.

The ACS Net begins at 1930 hours (7:30 p.m.) local time each Thursday evening, on the WA6GG repeater at 442.050 MHz, positive offset, tone 127.3 Hz. The purpose of this net is to practice Net Control skills, practice checking in with deployment status in a formal net, and to share information regarding upcoming ACS events. Guests are welcome to check in. ACS Members should perform Net Control duty on a regular basis. On the second Thursday of each month, the net will be conducted on the output frequency of the WA6GG repeater, 442.050 MHz no offset, tone 127.3 Hz, simplex.

San Francisco Police Department: Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)

The Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a citizen disaster preparedness program designed. The ALERT program is for volunteers 16 years of age or older, who live, work, or attend high school in San Francisco.

Graduates of the San Francisco Police Activities League (P.A.L) Law Enforcement Cadet Academy are also eligible to join.

ALERT volunteers will first complete the Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) (www.sfgov.org/sfnert) training and then graduate into an 8 hour Police Department course specifically designed for ALERT team members.

ALERT members will work closely with full-time and/or Reserve Police Officers in the event they are deployed after a disaster. The Basic ALERT volunteer will have no law enforcement powers other than those available to all citizens.

SFPD ALERT Training

The next SFPD ALERT training class has been scheduled for Saturdays September 22, 2018. The class will be held at the San Francisco Police Academy, in the parking lot bungalow, from 8am-5pm (one hour lunch break) on Saturday.

** Class dates indicated in red are only for new members who have not completed either SFFD NERT training or the SFPD Community Police Academy.

IMPORTANT- All participants must complete the background interview process in order to be eligible to attend the ALERT training class.

All active/trained ALERT members are asked to join us for our next training drill, scheduled for an evening on 9:00 am – 1:00pm August 4,2018. Details will be emailed to active ALERT members, prior to the date of the exercise. Participation is not required, but strongly encouraged.

The ARRL report said that the HAM band conditions were fair? Not with us. With the invaluable help of Jim Fahy N6WKY we put up some super antennas with his custom built antenna launcher. We got the 20 meter antenna in place and way in the clear that made a huge difference with our successful distant HAM radio contacts. Everything we heard we could talk back to.

With the Apple building across the street almost completed, they were no longer using there building construction arc welding tools that was causing interference noise. The noise level was down (S-3 to S-4).

We setup and operated 2A in both SSB and CW. However, most folks came to our ARRL Field Day not for so much to operate on the HAM bands but for the socializing with other hams and club members, enjoying good foods, and maybe even for raffle prizes. Oh, I almost forgot, many folks came because our Fire Department indoor facilities were excellent, we had AIR CONDITIONING, running water, ice making machine, and a "real" bathroom. It was a hot day with temperatures in the 90s. All the other groups in our area (FAR, PARA, WVARA, CARES) were all outdoors without air conditioning.

A total of 930 points (highest score ever for us).








