We went all out again. We have given away enough Japanese radios designed for ham use. Again, the club will offer a commercial radio. I know of no other ham club that offers a commercial radio for their raffle prize.

The grand prize for our April Meeting will a Motorola GP68 UHF commercial handie talkie. It covers 430-470 MHz. So it covers amateur, police, GMRS, and FRS, all in one radio without degradation in performance in both transmit and receive mode. Frequencies and PL can be front keypad programmable. The only thing it doesn't do is trunking. Ham's don't do trunking anyway. I have had one of these radios now for about 18 months and I must say, it is a very high performance radio. It has a very good combination of body chassis and antenna design which makes it an excellent performer. In my opinion, it's a great performer and certainly can run circles around most "ham" radios. It comes with programming software, drop in charger, manual, and belt clip. If you wish to find out more about this radio go to Google and just enter "Motorola GP68".
